## **Monopoly Activity**

- ➤ This activity was developed by Maine Jump\$tart for the 2017 Financial Foundations for Educators Training. Attached are the rules and game cards created for that event. You can easily modify this activity to use with students or other groups.
- This version is designed to be played in +/- 60 minutes. You can alter the rules to speed it up, make it longer, etc.
- For the teacher training event we substituted the special cards for some of the Chance and Community Chest cards. You can do that, simply add to the existing Monopoly cards, or create an entire set of your own cards.
- ➤ The idea is use the foundational lessons and structure of the Monopoly game to support your work in personal finance – and to have fun!

# Foundations in Personal Finance-Summer Teacher Training 2017 Monopoly

**The Idea:** have a little fun, break up the intensity of the sessions, and, think about the myriad of personal finance lessons that are part of a game of Monopoly. And, did I mention having a little fun?

**The Stakes:** other than the obvious table-champion-bragging-rights...? The winner at each table will win a reasonably fabulous prize (reasonable for a conference, not for Wheel of Fortune!). And...the overall winner from the whole room will win a cash prize of TBA (it will be nice - more than \$1, probably).

#### The Set Up:

- Played in groups of 4 or 5 (5 is best, 4 if necessary)
- Deeds distributed as follows: one monopoly per player; remaining deeds are open for purchase
- Each player gets \$1500
- NO \$1 bills all rents and payments rounded to nearest \$5 (but cannot be \$0 for example, a rent of \$2 = \$5. A rent of \$11 = \$10. \$27 = \$30
- Cards property assessment and some other minor cards taken out. Additional cards created just for this event have been added to the deck
- Play will end when it's time for lunch. During lunch you will have to do the adding up and closing out, scorecards, idea cards, etc.
- Come up with a name for your table

#### Rules of Play (which differ from regular rules):

- ANYTHING NOT COVERED HERE use standard Monopoly rules or consult Gamemaster
- Player cannot buy houses until beginning of 3rd turn
- Available properties can be bought any time a player lands on them. If the player who lands on the
  property does not want to buy it, it goes to auction for interested players. Bidding starts at face
  value and increases in increments of \$10
- Any money not paid to players goes to the bank
- Free Parking is "Free Trade Zone". <u>Trades</u> can be made <u>only</u> when a player lands there. Trades can include developed properties "as is" (they can be traded with houses/hotels included)
- The "Income Tax" space is inactive. Income tax will be paid at end of game
- If you land in jail you must exit on your next turn by a) using a "Get Out of Jail Free" card if you have (or can buy) one; or b) rolling doubles; or c) paying \$50. Unlike standard rules, you may try to roll doubles and, if failing to do so, pay the \$50 on the same turn, and then have your turn
- No alliances, please.

#### Closing Out & Adding Up:

- A notice will be given for "final round" (this will be with approx. 10 minutes left). Play should end after the last person in the order has their final turn.
- When finished, active players should:
- 1. Pay property tax: \$10 per house and/or \$50 per hotel.
- 2. Pay income tax: 20% on cash balances above \$1500 (i.e., after paying property tax, player has  $$1920 \text{ cash.} $1920 $1500 = $420. $420 \times .20 = $84 -- round up to an $85 tax bill).$
- 3. Total up: cash + mortgage value of active, *purchased* properties + *cash-in* value (50% of cost) of houses and hotels. Value of "dealt" deeds NOT included in these calculations.
- 4. List players on scorecard in order based on the value of their portfolio. List ALL players note if player was bankrupted and by whom.
