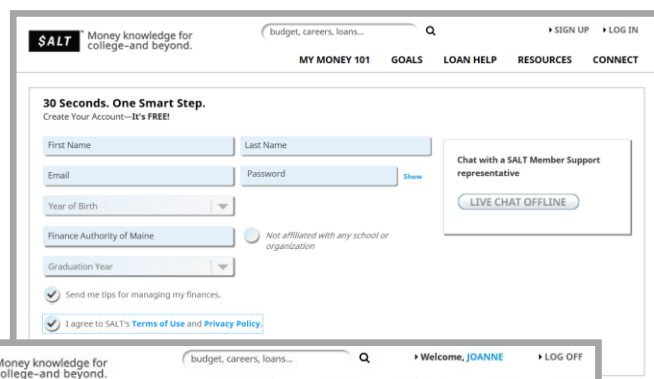

Get Money Smart with My Money 101™

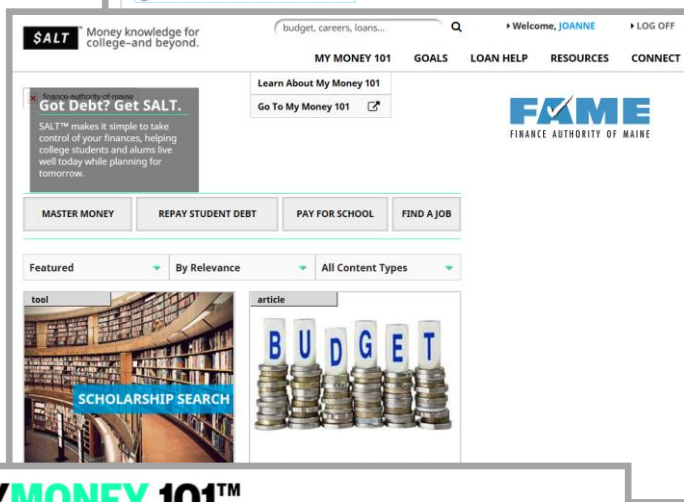
Step 1: Visit saltmoney.org/FAME to sign up for a SALT™ account.

Step 2: Choose Go To My Money 101 from the drop down menu. If you don't see this option, you need to enter Finance Authority of Maine in your profile.

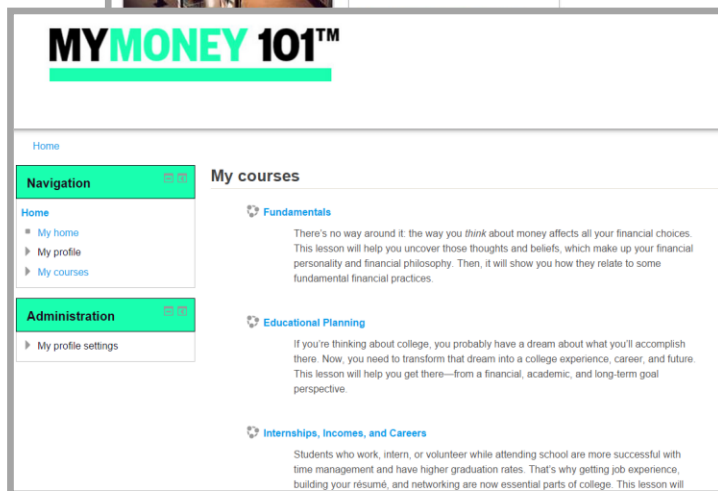
